**Ballet Austin Docents Provide Arts and Inspiration for Students in
their Community**

*Volunteers reach more than 15,000 children in the Austin Area
through The Nutcracker School Show Series*

AUSTIN, TX – December 2, 2004 - It is her toughest performance of the season. Armed only with her handbook, overhead visuals and bag of supplies, she looks out into the crowd of third and fourth graders and begins to speak. Marla Hiller is a docent for the Nutcracker School Show Series and will spend the next 45 minutes sharing with these children the magic and wonder of the Nutcracker ballet.

“We all look back to our childhood and remember *The Nutcracker* as a treasured part of our holiday season, and this is many children’s first introduction to what will become a lifelong tradition,” Michele Starkloff, Ballet Austin Community Outreach and Education (CORE) director said.

At Lakeway Elementary, Marla Hiller takes on the responsibility of introducing this classic ballet to her neighbors in the community first in the classroom, and then on a field trip to see one act of *The Nutcracker*, December 7 – 9 at Bass Concert Hall. Her presentation includes a review of the history of ballet; a discussion of the four parts of the ballet – dancing, music, décor and drama; and a preview of the story of *The Nutcracker*.

Halea Hayden, Chair of the Docent Program for Ballet Austin Guild said, “The Docent Program introduces the magic of ballet to thousands of school children in more than 100 schools.” The approximately 35 docents are comprised of Ballet Austin Guild members and volunteers who will help Ballet Austin’s Nutcracker School Show Series reach more than 15,000 students in Central Texas. “The School Show Series and the Docent Program not only allow children the opportunity to participate in the production of *The Nutcracker*, but it also offers a program of educational curriculum taught in the classroom before they ever arrive in the theater,” said Ms. Hayden.

The Ballet Austin Guild is a volunteer organization formed in 1975 to support and promote the interests of Ballet Austin in greater Austin and surrounding communities through educational

Choreographed by Stephen Mills, Ballet Austin's artistic director, and set to the timeless music of Pyotr Tchaikovsky, with live accompaniment by the Austin Symphony Orchestra, *The Nutcracker* delights children of all ages. *The Nutcracker* runs December 5 – 21, 2004 at Bass Concert Hall and tickets range from \$17 – 75.
